1. Introduction and Background

Cloverbelt Country Meats Co-operative (CCMC) a full-service abattoir and retail entity supporting local food security and farming families since 2016, invites proposals for qualified engineering consulting firms to assist in assessing their meat plant and designing a building expansion to the existing meat processing plant. The plant is located at 60 Griffith Rd in Oxdrift ON.

The expansion aims to accommodate business growth, including an enlarged retail store, additional cold storage area, an additional shipping & receiving bay/ramp, and the conversion of the existing retail store into a dry storage area.

This project is led by a partnership between the CCMC and the Rural Agri-Innovation Network (RAIN), a Division of the Sault Ste. Marie Innovation Centre (SSMIC). The project is part of RAIN's Responsive Advancement for Meat Processing (RAMP) Program with support from FedNor to strengthen Northern Ontario meat processors. The RAMP strives to stimulate the expansion of the meat processing sector in Northern Ontario and promote adaptation of new technologies. RAIN has taken a comprehensive approach that includes management training, funding for eligible projects, and expansion assessments.

2. Qualifications

Interested firms must have a Professional Engineer (P.Eng) on staff who will actively work on this project. Experience with food processing plants is highly desired.

3. Scope of Work

The selected firm will be expected to:

- Conduct a thorough assessment of the existing meat plant with a site visit.
- Design a building expansion considering the specific requirements, including a larger retail store, cold storage, shipping/receiving bay with ramp, and a dry storage area.
- Generate CAD designs of the proposed expansion.
- Provide cost estimates for materials required for the proposed design.
- Attend meetings: A minimum of 3 x meetings with CCMC and RAIN Director
 - To refine scope of work plan
 - To review progress to mitigate any challenges
 - To present the design

The selected consultant will be expected to work closely with the CCMC team to ensure that the deliverables meet the needs of the organization and align with the objectives of the RAMP program. Please note that these deliverables may be subject to changes or additions based on the needs identified throughout the project.

4. Proposal Requirements

Each proposal must include:

- A description of the firm's qualifications and previous similar projects completed. Must specify the project manager and key personnel involved.
- A detailed methodology and work plan for carrying out the project.
- A schedule that ensures project completion by December 31, 2023.
- Prices quoted by the Consultant shall include a lump sum amount for all deliverables, as well as hourly rates for all staff and estimated charges for travel and incidentals. All pricing shall be provided in Canadian Funds, inclusive of all applicable duties and taxes (with HST itemized separately).

5. Timeline & Submission Details

All proposals must be received no later than August 4, 2023.

6. Compliance

The project must adhere to the Meat Inspection Act and will be developed in coordination with Meat Inspection staff from the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food & Rural Affairs.

7. Proposal Submission

The Proponent must submit one (1) electronic copy (as a PDF file). Proposals are to be marked with the RFP title, with the full legal name and return address of the proponent. Proposals should be submitted via email no later than August 4, 2023 to David Thompson, RAIN Director - dthompson@ssmic.com
